## **NSCF PUF Data Dictionary**

### February 2012

**Note:** This data dictionary lists each variable in the NSCF PUF. For each variable, the variable name and variable label are provided. User notes about the variable are provided as needed. Values and value labels are provided for categorical variables. A range is provided for continuous variables. Please note that all variables could also have missing values. Missing values and labels are described in Chapter 5 of the User's Manual for the NSCF PUF.

The following abbreviations are used in the data dictionary:

SM = Sample member

HH = Household

#### P\_ID

PUF: Case Identification Number

Westat randomly assigned the Identification Number to each individual included in PUF using a random number generator routine.

#### P\_FNL

PUF: Final Status Code

This variable identifies whether the respondent completed the computer assisted interview inperson (CAPI) or over the telephone (CATI). The original variable (FNL) distinguished between CATI respondents that phoned in for the interview and those that did not. All CATI respondents are reported in one category for this recoded variable.

For respondent confidentiality masking purposes, values greater than 6 have been grouped.

If the respondent indicated "Other" as the reason, the interviewer then obtained the reason. This variable reflects one of the reasons given by respondents who indicated "Other" in C13. This reason was not read aloud to all respondents.

If the respondent indicated "Other" as the reason, the interviewer then obtained the reason. This variable reflects one of the reasons given by respondents who indicated "Other" in C13. This reason was not read aloud to all respondents.
