
40% of all U.S. households with children under age 18 include mothers who are either the sole or primary source of income for the family.




1 in 3

Among people age 65 and older, unmarried women and widows rely much more heavily on the income they receive from Social Security (45%) than either unmarried men (33%) or couples (28%).
