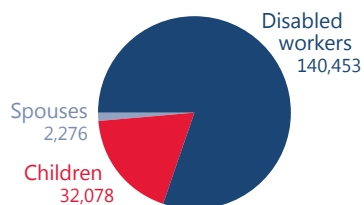
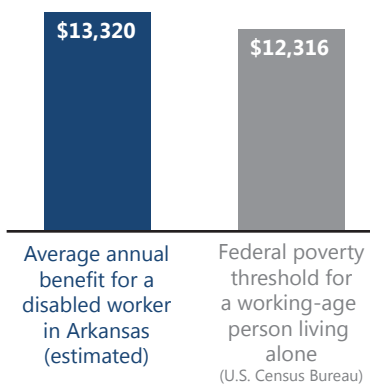




Most DI beneficiaries in Arkansas are disabled workers
