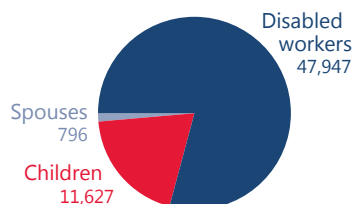
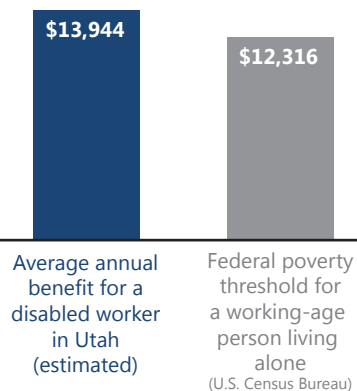




Most DI beneficiaries in Utah are disabled workers
