Benefits and Beneficiaries Under Public Employee Retirement Programs, 1980*

During calendar year 1980, the number of persons receiving benefits from civilian and military Federal, State, and local employee retirement systems rose to 5.8 million, 5.4 percent higher than in the previous year. The amount of such benefits was \$41.1 billion, or 17.1 percent more than in 1979. Retirement systems covering Federal employees, including members of the armed services, accounted for about two-thirds of the benefit payments and slightly more than half the beneficiary population. These percentages have remained constant since the mid-1960's.

Table 1 presents 1980 data on the amount of benefits and number of beneficiaries for each retirement system, arranged according to the category of benefit received. Table 2 shows the percentage distribution of this data by benefit category and level of government. The State and

local government figures are aggregated from the 3,075 separate retirement systems surveyed by the 1977 Census of Governments.¹ Nearly three-fourths of all the benefits paid in the "State and local" category, however, were paid by the 197 State systems included in the sample. The 2,878 local systems accounted for only 28 percent of the total.

Table 3 shows the average annual benefit amount in each category of receipt for both Federal and State-local systems. Average benefits are shown in both current and constant (1980) dollars for selected years from 1970 to 1980. In constant dollars, the category for Federal survivor benefits showed the largest percentage increase—59.6 percent—over the 10-year period. The largest percentage decrease was seen in monthly survivor benefits under State and local systems: 39.8 percent.

Tables 4 and 5 provide time series data on public employee retirement systems—table 4 by category of risk and table 5 by level of government. Data for the Federal civil service and armed services are shown separately in table 5.

Data on the beneficiary population of State and local

government retirement systems are available only through the quinquennial Census of Governments reports, last published for the 1977 census. Intercensile year figures are estimated by the Social Security Administration's Office of Retirement and Survivors Insurance, based on the amount of benefits paid during the year. The total amount of benefits paid by State and local retirement systems is published annually by the

Bureau of the Census for the fiscal year.² Calendar year figures presented here are derived from an aggregation of fiscal years 1980 and 1981. The proportion of benefits assigned to each risk category is estimated by using the proportions observed in the most recent Census of Governments. Data on Federal retirement systems are taken from reports of the administering agencies.
